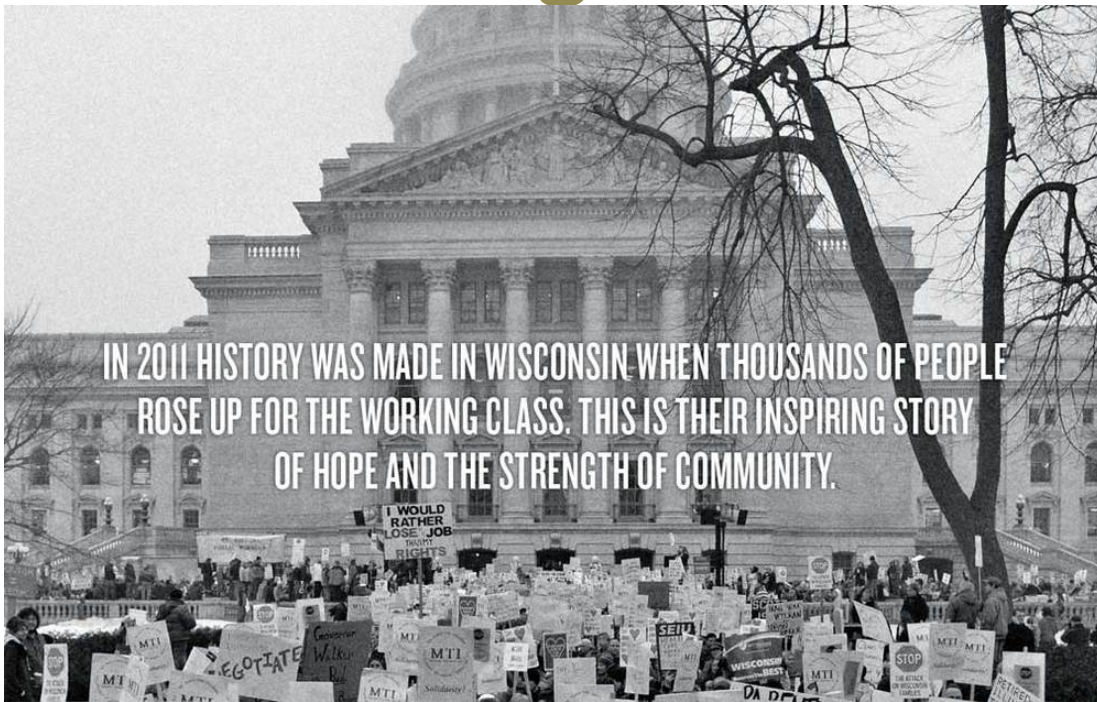


Labor History Through Film
